

## M&G Optimal Income

### Opinion

- This Recommended fund has been managed since its launch by an experienced fixed income practitioner, Richard Woolnough.
- As a long-standing fund manager, he has navigated a wide variety of economic and market cycles. At the heart of the approach is his assessment of medium-term value in bond markets and he is willing to reflect strong views in the portfolio where he has conviction.
- The inclusion of some equities reinforces the manager's desire to identify value, wherever it resides across the capital structure.

### Characteristics and Utility

- The fund's flexible mandate means that the manager has a broad opportunity set at his disposal and is able to position the fund for a variety of market and economic scenarios.
- The manager's economic assessments are key to the fund's outcome and he is willing to express his views with conviction. Furthermore, he invests with a strong valuation discipline and is quite prepared to persist with contrarian views where his investment thesis is intact.
- Notwithstanding the diverse nature of the sector, investors should not be surprised by a differentiated risk/return outcome and hence, should be prepared to take a longer-term perspective on the holding.
- The ability to include a modest allocation to equities is not unique within this sector, but it clearly introduces additional risk to the mix.
- The fund is appropriate for investors looking for a mainly fixed income fund that is managed actively according to economic conditions and value opportunities.

### Risk Commentary

The fund's KIID Synthetic Risk and Reward Indicator (SRRI) is 4. This is a regulatory measurement that is, where possible, calculated from the volatility of its weekly performance over a five-year period. A score of 4 means the fund's historic volatility is between 5% and 10%.

The fund's five year observed standard deviation is similar to that of key peers in this heterogeneous sector, although given the flexibility that is permitted in this sector, outcomes have the potential to be more variable when compared to mainstream corporate bond funds. The manager has utilised the fund's flexible mandate to shift portfolio allocations through time, including exposure to equities. Different share classes could have differing SRRI scores.

### Fund Snapshot

An unconstrained fixed income fund that can also invest up to 20% in equities. The fund's flexible mandate allows the manager to invest across the fixed income spectrum according to the economic outlook and the investment opportunity. He is willing to express his views with conviction. Within its sector, the fund features in our 'Dynamic' category.

### Investment Team

The fund is managed by Richard Woolnough, who began his career in 1985 and joined M&G in 2004. Stefan Isaacs, Deputy CIO of Public Fixed Income and Head of Wholesale Fixed Income, is the deputy fund manager. They benefit from the resources available within the wider team, including a large team of public credit analysts.

### Investment Philosophy

The manager believes that he can outperform the individual bond sectors over time through a flexible approach, in which he allocates to different parts of the market according to his economic expectations. His analysis of the most attractive way to invest in company's capital structure in risk/reward terms may also result in equity exposure.

### Investment Process

The manager's macro-economic analysis is the key input to the process, insofar as he seeks to identify the most likely medium-term economic scenario, which determines the fund's interest rate sensitivity (duration), yield curve and credit quality strategies. He reaches his views through fundamental analysis of global growth indicators, inflation statistics and other macro-economic variables. This research also generates preferences for different parts of the fixed income market, from government bonds to high yield bonds.

The selection of individual bonds for the portfolio is dependent upon the credit analyst team's rigorous issuer analysis. This internal credit rating and monitoring process incorporates industry research, company balance sheet analysis and stress testing. The approach often includes company meetings. The analysts are also responsible for regular, comprehensive sector reviews to support their relative value recommendations. When he has identified companies in which to invest, the flexible nature of the mandate allows the manager then to consider the most attractive way to implement a position, in conjunction with his economic outlook and the relative value within each company's capital structure. He may invest in stock or bonds.

### Portfolio Construction and Risk Controls

The mandate is deliberately broad to allow the manager the flexibility to position the portfolio with conviction according to his economic outlook. With this in mind, he can invest up to 100% of assets in each of government bonds, investment grade corporate bonds or high yield bonds. However, equities are limited to 20% of the portfolio and at least 80% of the fund must be hedged to sterling. Individual investment grade issuers are limited to 5%, with high yield issuers capped at 3% each. Derivatives can be used for investment purposes, efficient portfolio management and hedging.

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
